Dear Neighbor,

Here is an overview of what is planned for this summer:

39th Street Utilities. Utility related work will begin on 39th Street between H and J Streets and continue through the summer. This will involve opening trenches along 39th Street as we upgrade utilities. Traffic on 39th Street will remain open but at times may be limited to one lane – please take care to follow any instructions given by either signage or traffic flaggers.

New School Site. Site preparations continue for the future Sacred Heart Parish School. School construction will begin in earnest this summer. Hours of construction are Monday–Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Hospital Campus Utility Work. Mercy will begin underground utilities work on the hospital’s south parking lot, followed by other on-site work continuing this summer. This work will focus on I Street, 39th Street, and Spine Street. This work is timed to take place during school summer vacation.

Save Gas Money and Spare the Air. Join us at our Transportation Fair on June 28 from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at Sacred Heart Parish School, at 39th & H Streets. Enjoy free ice cream, music, and bike tune-ups.

Off-site Employee Parking. Some Mercy employees are now parking off-site and taking the Capitol shuttle to the Mercy campus.

Free Community Shuttle. The free Mercy General Hospital shuttle now runs Monday–Friday from 5:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m., every 30 minutes, to both the 29th and 39th Street Light Rail Stations.
